Effective October 1, 2019 four of our skilled nursing centers – Washington, Heartland, Fair Havens and Shawnee will transfer to new owners. In the case of Washington, the Supportive Living community will remain with Christian Horizons.

The Christian Horizons executive team shared the news with associates on September 16 at which time they had the opportunity to meet with Sheridan Healthcare Services - the new owners.

It is important to note these communities will not be closing. They will continue to operate and serve their residents and guests. Christian Horizons is working with everyone to ensure a smooth transition.

The decision to divest these four communities was made after prayerful consideration and only after we identified a buyer we believed upheld similar values.

The velocity of change in senior living requires wise stewardship to remain sustainable and relevant to those we serve. To meet these challenges, the Christian Horizons Board approved a new strategic plan early 2018. This change aligns with that plan.

Christian Horizons is evolving into new services and programs to meet the needs of future generations of older adults. You will be hearing more about those new services in the coming months.

I see a very bright future for Christian Horizons in living our mission and serving older adults.
